Dale held academic appointments in departments of philosophy, religion, and English at California State University, Long Beach, Westminster College, and Antioch University teaching courses in ethics, political philosophy, existentialism in literature, symbolic logic, and philosophy of religion as well as specialized courses in American utopian communities, American alternative religious movements, religious worldviews, and leadership theory and practice. Between pursuit of academic degrees, Dale worked several years as a writer/editor for Autonetics (a division of North American Aviation) and Convair Corporation producing proposals, reports, and technical papers for publication.
